Term 4 at a Glance	
Maths ~ Strategy & Strand	Strategy focus Y1: Additive Thinking. This includes counting forwards and backwards, number bonds and different adding and subtracting strategies. Strategy focus Y2: Multiplicative Thinking: skip counting, repeated addition, arrays, multiplication, equal sharing, division, families of facts. Strand focus: Length and area. We will look at different ways to measure things.
Inquiry	Concept: Belonging Learning Context: Our local area Big Questions: Where do we live? What are the significant landmarks in our area?
PE and Health	Swimming: Rooms 17 - 19, 21 - 24 will complete our swimming lessons weeks 3 and 4 of this term. Students will swim daily for 8 days in a small group. Please ensure they have their swimming kits everyday (please see the separate notice). Navigating the Journey, Theme 4: Growing and changing (see separate letter).
Learning through Play	We are continuing with learning through play to begin our day in Year 1. This helps our students to start their day off well and is a great time for us to get to

know your child better and discover their interests. Once we have found some interests, we use this to extend their learning and have mini inquiries within each classroom.

Rooms 21, 22, 23 and 24 play on the mornings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. On Wednesdays, we will do other activities. This is to help prepare students for the transition to Year 2 next year.

Rooms 15 and 20 will continue to play each morning as they settle into school.

Active Learner Traits Key Competencies

Please feel free to work on these at home.

We will focus mainly on these two Active Learner Traits in 2023. We will unpack the other Active Learner Traits throughout the year but dive deeper in what these two traits mean:

Managing Me: Making choices—I can decide if something is right or wrong and make the right choice. I can decide who I work best with. I know what to do when faced with conflict.

<u>Collaborating Me: Teamwork</u> - I can work with someone else and share. I can work and play with new people.

Literacy

Phonological Awareness:

<u>Identifying Rhyme</u> - which two of these rhyme? hat, man, sat; night, light, mouse. <u>Creating rhyme</u> - what rhymes with pin? fin? frog? hog.

* Bite sized structured literacy will be on the Waterloo School Facebook page and in the newsletter throughout the term.

<u>Initial sounds</u> - retrieval of words that begin with the same sound: see, sand, sink; shrimp, shop, shred.

Blending sounds - w-e-b is web, s-i-ng is sing.

Segmenting sounds - fox is f-o-x, chip is ch-i-p.

Nursery Rhymes: having fun with rhyming words, hearing each sound in a word-blending sounds and segmenting words.

Poetry - exploring rhyme and poetic language, reciting poems and rhymes.

Handwriting: learning the correct letter formation and pencil grip. Using the 'dirt, grass, sky' guides to place letters correctly on a line.

<u>Reading:</u> instructional reading in groups using a Structured Literacy approach. This includes learning letter sounds, blending sounds to read words and sentences using decodable texts.

<u>Writing</u>: personal experience, non-fiction/factual writing (recipes, lists, reports, newspapers etc.). Dictated sentences linked to reading with a focus on correct letter formation and punctuation.

<u>Decodable Books:</u> If your child receives a decodable book to take home please take care of it, as these are to be returned to school for others to use.
